FAB Fireworks Campaign



Overview


The FAB Fireworks Campaign has a google docs available to the public for them to log the time, date, postcode and impact of fireworks

This has been available since 2016 and people are gradually becoming aware of it. The data recorded will be a very small percentage of the entire picture of fireworks in the UK, and shows instances reported evenly across the country



Highlight Stats

- About 65% of fireworks were logged 'out of season' for 2016-2020 if season is traditional 1st 8th November and 31st Dec-1st Jan. We excluded New Year and Bonfire Night, but Diwali and Chinese New year are movable dates
- 32.5% go off after 9pm for 2016-2020, a time when most children and many adults are asleep
- 99% of all fireworks logged were random and people were not warned – so people cannot prepare in any way
- Only 0.5% were known as professional displays, highlighting the adhoc nature of fireworks




Displays Logged by Location



- Fireworks are being logged by the public across the UK
- Have been since 2016


Displays Logged Outside of 'Season' by Month




- Fireworks are going on throughout the year, not just a few days
- These exclude 'season' of 1st 8th Nov and 31st-1st Jan
- As only a limited number of people know about the log this can only be a subset of the reality
- 2016 until April 2020

Displays Logged by Hour - out of 'Season'

- Excluding 'season' of 1st 8th Nov and 31st-1st Jan
- Fireworks are happening out of core season at all hours, including many from 9am to 2am
- 2016 until April 2020




Did People have Warning



- The logs clearly show that people have no warning in the majority of cases
- The nature of this noise is sudden, with no time to prepare
- Based on data from 2018 to April 2020

The Nature of the Displays Logged

- Only 1% logged for all years were known professional displays
- The overwhelming majority of fireworks heard between 2016 and 2020 are not from professional displays



Conclusions

- There is no 'fireworks season' for which people and animals can be prepared.
 They are logged throughout the year 65% out of 'season'
- 99.5% of fireworks logged had no warning, so there is no way to prepare for sufferers of PTSD, for animals, for people wanting to sleep
- 32.5% are going off at times when most children and many adults are in bed
- Only 0.1% of fireworks logged are known displays
- Assuming this a small percentage of all instances of UK fireworks, the numbers
 of displays and the impact are far more than these representative numbers
- The RSPCA says about 50% of pets are distressed by fireworks. These statistics highlight that for people and animals, there is no way to prepare and lessen their distress they go off at all times of day and any day of the year
- Legislation that balances people's desires for firework displays, and individual rights to not be distressed throughout the year, is needed now
